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## 1. Preface

It's ready again, the Christmas catalog 2025. Every year it remains a pleasure to put together the catalogue, write texts, arrange interviews, take photos and above all enjoy all the beautiful things we have ordered.

We start early with the preparations, we had already bought the Christmas boxes a year and a half ago. Actually with the idea of putting them in the Christmas catalog last year, but yes, that turned out differently. And maybe it's a good thing, we've had so much fun coming up with products for the contents of the box. But also other patterns, fabrics and threads have been ordered early, since the end of September there are several boxes in my storage room with stuff for this Christmas catalog.

A recurring theme is "finishing" your stitching projects. We have collected various finishing materials for you so that you can continue finishing your project right away. For example, there is a beautiful fabric set of the latest Christmas fabrics from Teresa Kogut, we have custom-cut circles for Christmas ornaments and there is even real Christmas chenille available. And don't forget to order half a meter of interfacing, which is really indispensable when finishing your stitching.

A first are the patterns from Notforgotten Farm, these patterns are now also available in Europe for the first time. We loved Lori's little dolls so much that we stitched three of them and Coby finished them as small chess pieces. But besides these dolls you will also find the cutest Christmas patterns of her on page 41.

Our designers this year are Pansy Patch Quilts and Stitchery and Blueberry Ridge Designs, a mother and daughter who both design stitching patterns. Get to know them and their designs on page 48. The free patterns they have made available ensure that you have another nice addition to your collection of Christmas patterns.

Finally, of course, we also have a gift (when spending at least 15 euros and 1 per customer). This year I have designed project cards for you on which you can keep track of exactly what you have used for the project, when you started, what changes you have made and basically everything you want to write down for later viewing. The project cards fit in a standard photo folder, so you can easily shop them.

I wish you a lot of fun viewing and reading this Christmas catalog and hope that we will see you either in the shop or have contact again by email.

In the summer I already ordered a number of patterns from Marty that are no longer available through our distributor. I especially like the shape of the socks, really different from the usual Christmas stocking. And they are especially suitable for hanging all year round.





We have another pile of beautiful books by Christiane Dahlbeck in the shop. And those books are always a joy to look through. Not only do you have atmospheric photos to get into the Christmas mood, but her patterns are so very beautiful. Christiane really has a gift for designing patterns that are different. They have a kind of fairytale look and I love her animals. They look so real, you would almost expect to see them in your garden.


For this Christmas Open Days we have no less than five books back in the shops. I can't say I have a favorite, I like them all. To start with, we have *Florales Winter* and *Florales Herbst*. As the title indicates, these books are mainly about nature scenes. I really love the winter pattern with all those little motifs, you can stitch so many different things with it. The Christmas tree is also a cutie.

*Florales Herbst* also has such a collection pattern but with autumn motifs. That fox really stole my heart, especially in combination with the little fox. In her books, Christiane shows what you can do with the separate motifs.


Then we have *Ein schönes halbes Jahr Teil 2*, which also focuses entirely on autumn and winter. I think the squirrel that is almost hiding in one of the patterns is so sweet. I have a soft spot for those fluffy creatures. Occasionally I see one in the forest here. The pattern with the boxes can be used for so many different finishes, I'm going to look for a small frame and then stitch one of those patterns for it.

*Lieblingszeit* is full of deer, another animal that I like to see. When I drive to my other work, I regularly come across a few deer in the same area. I actually think it's a gift every time I see them. Now that it is starting to get colder, there is also a jump of deer near Roden that I see regularly. That is the advantage of winter, then they appear a bit more.


We had *Winterwelt* in the shop a long time ago and is now back. An ultimate Christmas and winter book that can make you so happy. #### 4. Crocette a Gogo

Christmas is not complete without the Christmas patterns from Crocette a Gogo. This year we have included three smaller patterns in our collection. Santa is Coming shows how Santa Claus is on his way to a (your?) house to deliver presents. I am curious what he will bring. I might leave out the sentiment and stitch some more trees instead. What would you do?

The annual Santa Claus exudes the warm atmosphere of Christmas with this cheerful, traditional Santa Claus, surrounded by an idyllic winter scene. Santa Claus is surrounded by cute little birds. That birdhouse alone is a picture to stitch. He hasn't forgotten his bag of presents either, and the birds can't wait to see what's inside.

The new pattern that matches the other nativity scene patterns is no.4. This time we see Joseph and Mary with the baby Jesus and the stable animals are watching. If you have stitched the previous patterns, then this one definitely belongs in your collection.

In the spring I stitched Tiny Village from Crocette a Gogo and we have now finished it in a cute, soft green frame. And if I do say so myself, I think it's a cutie. For this version I used 16 ply natural linen, but of course you can also stitch it on other fabric.

These patterns have also been burning a hole in my "to stitch" list for a while now. They are so much fun and how nice they are to give the pattern to a stitching friend or the end result. You can choose your own colors and one of the Lapin Loup linens for example. Or take one of the fabrics from our fabric kits.

These three Christmas pillows can also be stitched very well with the thread from our Christmas chenille and then use the chenille for the finish. And then use the green thread for small accents in the cushions.

Happy Halloween doesn't specifically belong in this Christmas catalog of course, but I still wanted to share such a nice pillow. You could also stitch the pumpkin and the crow separately for a scissor hanger and the same goes for the kitten. But the pillow as a whole is really something for me to add to my Halloween collection of pillows.



## 6. Flossabilities

I met this designer duo at the Needlework Marketplace fair. It is a brother and sister who release these patterns together. I had seen the stitched cushions themselves before and I was so looking forward to meeting these designers. We had a great time talking about designs, patterns and international shipments. It was hard not to share this with you all this time, but now they have been revealed: the pillow patterns from Flossabilities.

For the Christmas catalogue we first ordered the Christmas pillow and Coby stitched it on Belfast linen with 2 threads Threadworx 1089. While it may not look like it, these pads are deceptive thread eaters. You really need two 5 yard strands or a 10 yard strand. At Threadworx you are in the right place, which are strands of 20 yards. But also the thread from Pirate + Robin is very suitable for these patterns.

Below you can see our version with Threadworx 1089, next to it the Noël thread from Pirate + Robin which I would also really like for it. If you are going to stitch it on finer fabric with 1 thread, then of course you need less thread than the 10 yards that are indicated. But if you stitch with 2 threads, you really need 10 yards.



There are many possibilities for the Winter cushion. You can of course use the light blue fabrics from the fabric packages.

The other two patterns we ordered are the Autumn and Halloween Pillow. I couldn't resist showing you those too. The fabrics in our fabric packages are really ideal for these pillows. With the Autumn Pillow you could choose Fein Floba from the Evenweave package with DMC 4515.

Or take the new green color from the Edinburgh package and use a Sulky color on it.

## 7. Kerstrecept 1: Tomato sauce à la Priscilla

The easiest way to make your own pasta sauce or a delicious tomato soup, I really love this recipe. And what also helps, it is super easy to prepare. Here's what you'll need:

1. 1 kg tomatoes (whichever you want)
2. Half bosje basilicum
3. 2 cloves of garlic (or more if you like)
4. 1 onion
5. Leftover vegetables that you have left, such as bell pepper, eggplant, celery, zucchini, carrot. It is useful if this is no more than half the amount of tomatoes.
6. Olive oil
7. Salt and pepper to taste

Procedure:

1. Cut the tomatoes into quarters or in half and place them in a baking dish.
2. Cut the onion and other vegetables into equal pieces
3. Drizzle the olive oil over this, add salt and pepper to taste and stir well.
4. Place the basil on top of the vegetables and put it in the oven at 200 degrees for 45-60



minutes. The basil gets quite dark but that doesn't matter.

5. Remove the baking dish from the oven, let it cool slightly and then put it all in a pan or blender. I use the hand blender to make sauce. You can just process the basil.

Et voilà, you now have delicious pasta sauce, or if you want to make tomato soup out of it, add vegetable stock. You can freeze the sauce and then use it when you need it.

This year we have three stitching rings for you to give your Christmas thread ring that little bit of extra Christmas atmosphere. You can choose from three different versions and because the bling, like a real diva, preferred to avoid the camera, I added the pictures. The ring is also included, so add some more [thread drops](#) and you can start your own Christmas thread ring.

## 9. Hands on Design / Summer House Stitche Workes

Imagine: a candle lit, a cup of hot chocolate is within reach, in front of you is a very nice Christmas stitching project that is not only beautiful, but also useful! With the pattern "That's a Wrap!" both Hands on Designs and Summer House Stitche Workes you can stitch a new type of accessory for your Christmas decor.

You make the cushions from, for example, our Teresa Kogut fabrics or get them from your own stock and we have chosen 4cm band to stitch these ribbons on. This way you don't have to spend a lot of time finishing the fabric, but you can "pack" the cushions right away with your stitched ribbons.

We absolutely love this new way of finishing. You can make the cushions as big as you want, we have chosen cushions of 12 x12cm. Then the band fits well in terms of proportion. Stitch the same patterns for the ribbon or, like we did, choose two different motifs.

To make it easy for you, we have prepared a set for you, enough ribbon and thread to stitch three sets of ribbons. As you can see we have already stitched a set, we have stitched 1 ribbon of each pattern and "bowed" it around the cushions.

### Between Friends – Winter Samplings

Do you ever have that too? You see a pattern and you think, is that new?

Why haven't I seen that before? And then it turns out that the pattern was released a year or more ago and you just missed it.

Of course it's not a disaster at all, because thanks to Flosstube, Instagram and Facebook, you can see what others are stitching and then suddenly think, I want to stitch that pattern too.

I had that with this book, I could vaguely remember that it had been published, but otherwise it hadn't stuck. Until I saw an stitching from this book and immediately became enthusiastic. So I ordered the book and looked at what I wanted to stitch for this Christmas Open Days. That eventually became one of the bobbins.

Now I don't really have a large collection of old, wooden bobbins so I was thinking about how it could be finished. While taping up the weekly mail, I suddenly got a good idea. We could use the cardboard tube with the tape around it as a bobbin. And then stitch one of the other patterns on top, so that it actually looks like a pindrum.

Fortunately, Coby was also very enthusiastic about this alternative finish and here you can see how the result turned out. I stitched the patterns with Sulky thread and you can also order the conversion. For the fabric I used 12.6 thread linen, because the tube is quite wide you have to repeat the pattern more often, but let's face it, then you also have a very nice finish.



In the book there are many more nice patterns, I actually want to stitch the strawberry and maybe the sampler as well. With such a bobbin of Sulky you can go ahead for a while. If you want to stitch everything from the book, I would order 2 sets.

Of course you can use the DMC colors that are indicated in the book, but I made a Sulky conversion. If you then stitch linen on Belfast or Edinburgh, the thread covers better and the pattern comes out nicely.

## 10. Happiness is Homemade

This designer is truly a discovery of the past year. You can understand that her monthly series with cats immediately caught my attention. What a nice idea and what a nice cats. I spoke to (name) at the Needlework Marketplace fair and she told me that although she is allergic to cats herself, her mother has a cat that models for her patterns.

Now I found it a challenge to see if I could give one of the cats a more Poekie appearance. I often use Copper Penny when I want to stitch Poekie, this thread has enough orange to match its coat and there is also enough light and dark in the thread. I found the Cat in a Cozy Green Sweater very suitable to use for this experiment, after all, a green sweater fits very nicely with an orange cat. You can see the result in the photo below. I am very satisfied and can look forward to stitching more patterns from this designer.

In addition to the monthly cat series, there are also various patterns in which a cat plays the leading role. I've already shown you my version of the Cat in a Cozy Green Sweater, you can also choose the blue version. And for a complete Christmas atmosphere, you can go for A Cat and Cardinal Christmas. With this last pattern I have visions of a little gold thread and red beads for the wreath that the cat has around her neck. And then I realize, I really don't have to try this with Poekie, such a wreath around his neck. Let's put it this way, Poekie is the type of "who doesn't want to hear, just have to feel" and I think I feel very well how he thinks about it.

The pattern below is a bit older but has been on my stitching list for years. And this year I stitched it. You can see that I have adjusted a few things. I filled the rug with gold thread and I gave both the reindeer and the squirrel an eye. The fabric I used is the [Superfein Floba](#), which is also in the Edinburgh fabric package. I thought it was great fabric to stitch on and also the right background for this pattern.


## 11. Heart in Hand Needleart

One of the nicest series that has been released in recent years for me is the Tiny Town series by Heart in Hand Needleart. I'm still eagerly waiting for a Stitchy and Kitten Tiny Town, but all the patterns that have appeared so far are just too cute.


For this Christmas catalog I have collected the last two Tiny Towns that have to do with Christmas. Frosty Tiny Town is everything you are looking for in a winter village scene. The Nativity Tiny Town is a cute nativity scene, which I can totally picture as the pin drum that stands next to it.

In addition to the regular Tiny Towns, you can also stitch the Frills. For the Nativity Tiny Town there are even two, you can add both the shepherds and the wise men to the pattern. You can find a place for these Frills yourself, I have seen an example where the shepherds are added on one side of the pattern and the wise men on the other side. You can actually put the snowman in front of the Frosty Tiny Town anywhere.

Or just stitch the Frills as separate ornaments. Of course, this also applies to the Tiny Town patterns themselves, you can always stitch a piece and finish it as an ornament. This way you can make your own Tiny Town Christmas tree.







## 12. Heartstring Samplery - houten garenhouders

Last summer, the participants of the Stitching Days received a wooden thread holder with the Heartstring Samplery project. It is a cute bunny that looks like the bunny in the pattern. But above all, it is a very beautiful thread holder, which is made with love by Matt, Beth's husband. She told us that he has the wood for such a thread holder at least 10 times in his hands to come up with this beautiful product. And the wood comes from trees that are on their own land.

I really wanted to have an assortment of Christmas/winter thread holders for this Christmas catalogue and Matt has been so kind to make a lot of them. You can choose from a Christmas tree, snow crystal, snowman and .... (fill in). According to Beth, you can wind up to 3 strands of DMC on the thread holder. But of course you can also choose your favorite color Christmas red, green, or a completely different color.


To let as many stitching enthusiasts as possible enjoy these thread holders, you can order a maximum of 1 per person. You can choose from a Christmas tree, ice crystal, sheep, snowman and Christmas ball. The wooden thread holders cost € 7.95 each. You can indicate in the comments field of your order whether you want an alternative if your first choice is sold out.





Before Beth came to visit this summer, I stitched two of her patterns. I liked these so much and wanted them to fit together nicely. So I stitched them on the same fabric and the thread is also in the same color family. Just a different color, but that way it fits together nicely.

As you can see, the second cushion has a slightly different text on it and I wanted the text to be similar. So I changed the text to Peace & Goodness. I could largely use the letters from the other pattern and the letters that weren't there I came up with myself.

### 13. Hello from Liz Mathews

If anyone releases Christmas patterns that make me think every year: I would like to stitch them all, it's Liz Mathews. Whether it's her style, her colors, her motifs, I don't know but one pattern is even more fun than the other.

This year we have a lot of new Christmas trees, I am a big fan of the Festive Mini Trees. How nice it would be to stitch these trees and then use them as a nameplate at Christmas dinner. Every guest immediately has a super personal gift to take home. Or stitch them and finish them in a custom cut passepartout card. You then draw that trunk underneath.

Santa's Night Tree is a pattern that Liz has previously released for Jingle Ball. And I like it anyway. It's another bigger Christmas tree that fits her 12 days of Christmas series. Maybe we should expand our "Hello from Liz Mathews" Christmas tree forest with this one. For the fabric, we recommend our Belfast 578, which is a jeans blue fabric that works well as a surface.

Our absolute favorite this year is the Quaker Christmas Star. We have adjusted the colors slightly, more to our style. Coby has stitched and finished the pattern and we are in ❤️ ❤️ ❤️ . What a nice way of finishing and then those beads on top of that, it has rightfully become the star of this Christmas. We have our colors Sullk and the matching beads ready for you, so you can get started right away. We have not received all the beads ordered, so there are a limited number of packages available. A new delivery is on its way to the supplier but they don't know yet when it will arrive.

## 14. Kerstrecept 2: Cranberry-Brie Bladerdeeghapjes

### Ingredients (± 12 appetizers)

1. 1 roll of chilled puff pastry (or 6 slices of frozen)
2. 100 g brie (in small pieces)
3. 100 g cranberry sauce (ready-made or homemade)
4. 1 egg (beaten, for brushing)
5. 1 tbsp honey
6. 1 sprig fresh rosemary (or a pinch dried)
7. pinch of salt
8. pinch of pepper

### Preparation

1. Preheat the oven to **200°C** (fan 180°C).
2. Cut the puff pastry into small squares (about 6x6 cm) and place them in a muffin tin or on a baking tray lined with baking paper.
3. Place a cube of brie in each piece of puff pastry.
4. Spoon a teaspoon of cranberry sauce on top.
5. Drizzle with a little honey.
6. Sprinkle with a pinch of salt, pepper and some rosemary.
7. If necessary, fold the corners of the puff pastry slightly inwards for a nice effect.
8. Brush the edges with beaten egg.
9. Bake in the oven for **12-15 minutes**, until the puff pastry is golden brown and crispy.



Serve warm as an appetizer or festive snack with the Christmas drink.



## 15. Kerstdoos

This year we have something special, we have put together a Christmas box with all useful and fun surprises in the field of Christmas stitching. This box, or rather, these boxes, have been upstairs in my guest room for over a year. We actually wanted to fill them last year, but well, that turned out differently. From the beginning of May, we have been thinking of the best surprises to put in this box.

We are not going to reveal what is in the box, we would like to leave that a surprise so that you can discover for yourself what is inside.

And the boxes are first only exclusively for sale in the shop. We have a limited number so that they are really exclusive and when they are gone, they are really gone.



So you can't order it in the webshop, but it is possible to send an email with the subject Christmas box 2025 and reserve the box if you come by on Friday or Saturday, for example. Picking up later is not possible at the moment, you really have to pick up the box during our Christmas Open Days. The Christmas box costs € 49.50.



I also think it would be nice to stitch the cardinal and the house separately and make two ornaments out of it. Or stitch a few of the holly leaves for a card or a small frame. But the whole thing is just a great pattern that deserves a nice spot on the wall.

Last year you could already admire Kathy's Christmas Quaker Stocking and we now have an stitched version in the shop, thanks to Inge. We chose to finish the pattern like a bell cord and replaced the words with some extra snow crystals. This way you can enjoy this beautiful pattern all winter long.

But if you think now, I still want to have a nice sock that I can hang all year round, then these patterns from Kathy are for you. I really like the shape of her "Christmas" socks, with that weird toe, it's just a little different than usual. You can choose from three different socks, all of which you can also stitch as an elongated sampler. The Quaker House Stocking & Sampler keeps swimming around in my head, but funnily enough, so does the Ocean Blue Stocking. And that while I don't really have anything to do with the sea, sand and beach.



### 17. Voor jouw gemak: cirkels van zuurvrij karton

Finishing an ornament often starts with an acid-free cardboard. And as long as that cardboard has straight edges, it can also be cut itself. But circles are more difficult. To make it easier for you, we have two different sets of circles this year. This way, you no longer have to spend time calculating the diameter and cutting a perfect circle.

The circles are available in a set of 9 and 10 cm and in a set of 11 and 12 cm. For example, you can use the smallest circles for finer fabric and the larger circles for coarser fabric. You get two copies of each circle so you can use them for a front and back. But if you have a piece of felt for the back, you can of course also use that and you have a circle for another ornament.


## 18. Kersttijdschrift

This year there are a lot of round patterns, so our [acid-free cardboard circles](#) can come in very handy. But round patterns also work well in a square frame.

My favorites for this year are The Sticherhood, Three Little Owls, Works by ABC en Stitch Sprout.

## 19. Glitter it up with these metallic threads from Sulky

Want to make your Christmas stitching a little extra Christmassy? Then use one of these metallic threads. You can also use the threads on the sewing machine. Use as many threads as you need for your stitching, they are quite thin threads so you can easily adapt them to your fabric. In addition to classic red, white, gold and green, you also get teal colors that I would love for snow scenes.

Use the orange for Christmas balls or accents on the clothing (think of buttons or motifs) and that brown color seems very nice to me to incorporate into the trunk of Christmas trees. Not the whole trunk, but the side on which the light shines.

You can use these colors for many different stitchies. And it gives your stitching that little bit of extra Christmas look.

## 20. Lapin Loup linnen

We received a number of unique, hand-dyed linens from Megan that we think fit perfectly with Christmas scenes. I came up with the names myself, which makes it a bit easier to explain what it's about. We cut the fabric in multiples of 45 x67cm.

The Biscotti color is a bit more yellow than in the picture and would do well for reproduction samplers, for the patterns from Notforgotten Farm, for Americana Blue for example and then with a warm shade of thread, in short you have a lot of possibilities for this. This is the only color we have in 14 and 16 thread linen, the other two colors we only have in 14 thread linen.

Then we also have Graveyard Mist in 14 thread linen, a color that has a little less brown than the Pebble color that we also have. The name suggests it a bit, for Halloween or autumn patterns this is an ideal color. The Pebble color can be used for reproduction samplers but also for example for the cat patterns from Happiness is Homemade, the patterns from Shakespeare's Peddler, or stitch a quirky nutcracker from Shannon Christine Designs.


## 21. Little Robin Designs

And maybe I can also stitch a few birds to add to my collection. I think this bird from Little Robin Designs is a cutie. If you leave out the text, you can actually leave the bird hanging all year round, but I think it has a Christmas atmosphere because of the chosen colors.

We are very happy that Inge has stitched these cushions for us, so that we can show them in this catalogue and in the shop. We have chosen 14 thread Edinburg antique white and the Dinky Dyes colors [131 \(red\)](#) and [302 \(green\)](#). There are more pillows in this series and I hope the designer will make a few more.

### Winter Stocking

It almost seems to be a theme this year, Santa Clauses in stockings. I saw this one for the Needlework Marketplace fair and I knew right away that it would be on my list. I'm not sure yet how I'm going to stitch it. In a way, it is also very attractive to make the Christmas stocking from felt and attach it to the linen. And then stitch those snow crystals with DMC and maybe a bead at the end? We'll see.

### Christmas Swan

This almost royal swan was another Christmas pattern that I really wanted to have. I think the composition is so funny, you can actually see it in front of you. A stately swan glides by in the water and takes her Christmas tree with her. I think it would be a good idea to at least use some metallic thread in the pattern and maybe some beads? That gives it just a little more Christmas atmosphere.

## 24. Notforgotten Farm

You may have already seen them on Facebook or Instagram, the little dolls of Notforgotten Farm (NFF). I saw them for the first time last year and was completely in love. During my Blackbird Designs weekend in Virginia I bought one of the patterns for myself. Then I thought, I'm going to stitch it for Christmas. Anyway, the radiation process came along and for a long time there was not much stitching.

When we started preparing for this Christmas catalogue, I suggested to see if we could add the patterns of these dolls from Notforgotten Farm as well. That was a little more difficult than expected. I had emailed Lori, the designer, sent a FB and Instagram message but heard nothing. Fortunately, I found a phone number for her and called her.

It went like this: I first got her husband on the phone and I introduced myself as Annemiek Koning from the Netherlands, who has an stitching shop. There was a moment of silence and then he asked if he was talking to a real person or a computer. Once we had solved that, I got Lori on the phone. She was very enthusiastic and really enjoyed selling her patterns outside the US for the first time.

So I'm very happy to present the little dolls from Notforgotten Farm and a number of other Christmas patterns that I really like. You can finish the figures as an ornament, as a cushion or make a small stand up and start your collection of NFF figures.

Absolute favorites of mine are Cinder Claus, Little Nick and Cookie Claus. Oswald and Mr. Frost come very close to that. Jingle All The Way is a pattern that I have had in my own collection for years and every time I see it it makes me happy. Maybe I'll start this pattern at Christmas this year, then it can hang in the shop next year.

We chose DMC 3777 [for the red color](#) because we liked that color better (I have a rather strong opinion about Christmas red colors) and still thought it matched the look of the patterns. Below you can see our version of these patterns, I literally stitched Little Nick in 2 days, I just couldn't stop.



In this series we also have Mr. Frost, I really can't wait to stitch this snowman. Maybe I'll start on Sunday, after the Christmas Open Days. And I probably don't have to explain that Oswald is the next doll I'm going to stitch.




Parson Brown is known for the song "In the meadow we will build a snowman". And yes, now that that's in your head, you keep singing this all evening ;-). I think I would go for a slightly darker fabric, but this is also such a wonderful pattern to stitch, not too many colors and just get started.

Merry Maker is a pattern that I would finish like a needle book.

You can then fold the stitching in half to the right of the Christmas tree. And if you need a few more crosses on the left, you can just extend the edge. What a beautiful Christmas needle book you would have.

Winter Fox is another favorite of mine, I like everything about this pattern, the fox, the trees, the way everything is designed, I might take a slightly darker orange rust just for the fox.

A pattern I had seen before on Instagram is Holly. I think this is such a beautiful pattern. It radiates a peace that we can use today. My idea would be to convert the threads to Sulky, so that I can use my beloved just short of white (1002) for this pattern on 14 ply fabric.

Finally, we have Jingle All the Way and Blue Bellsnickle. Jingle All the Way completely reflects what Christmas Eve can look like for me. I also love the border with houses at the bottom of the pattern. You could also stitch them separately and finish them as a pin drum.

Blue Bellsnickle is one of those patterns that you can also finish very well as a doll. I'm being honest, I don't know if I would stitch the pipe, but even without a pipe this is a great pattern. He would do well among Stacy Nash's Animal Crackers.

In het pakket vind je 10 meter chenille en twee kleuren DMC die perfect passen bij de kerstchenille. Je zou ook het Flossability Christmas kussentje kunnen borduren met bijvoorbeeld de rode kleur voor de motieven en de groene voor de randjes.

## 27. Kerstrecept 3: Gevulde portobello's met spinazie en geitenkaas

### Ingredients

1. 4 grote portobello's
2. 200 g verse spinazie
3. 1 onion, finely chopped
4. 2 cloves garlic, minced
5. 100 g soft goat's cheese (or feta as an alternative)
6. 2 tbsp olive oil
7. 2 tbsp breadcrumbs (or coarse breadcrumbs)
8. zout & peper

### Preparation

1. **Preparation:** Preheat the oven to 200 °C. Remove the stems from the portobello mushrooms.
2. **Make filling:** Heat olive oil in a pan. Sauté onion and garlic until translucent. Add spinach and let it shrink briefly. Season with salt and pepper. Let it cool slightly.
3. **To assemble:** Mix the spinach with crumbled goat cheese and breadcrumbs. Fill the portobello mushrooms generously with this mixture.
4. **Baking:** Place the portobello mushrooms in a baking dish and bake for about 15 minutes until the top is golden brown.



Delicious with a fresh salad and a side dish such as potato gratin or roasted vegetables.

Every now and then there is a pattern that may not be 100% Christmas, but it is 100% stitching, so I will include that in the Christmas catalog. In addition, this pattern has recently been stitched by a very sweet customer, who provides us with various models every year. We kept the color blue and opted for antique white linen. All the accessories that are on the pattern and that have to do with needlework I really belonged in the shop. Of course, you can choose your own color combination again. Choose something that fits well with your interior.

## 29. Pansy Patch Quilts and Stitchery en Blueberry Ridge Designs

Lori and Emily are a newer mother-daughter couple who design stitching designs. They both have their own company and their own style of patterns. I thought it would be so nice to hear what it's like when your mother or daughter is also a designer, so I asked them for the interview in our Christmas catalog. They wanted to do that. So meet the creative women behind Pansy Patch Quilts and Stitchery and Blueberry Ridge Designs.

Lori: I have always been very creative, from colouring as a child and learning to knit from my Nana and cross stitching with my mom in the 1980s and quilting and stitching. I have always wanted to own my own quilt shop. I have been a quilter for over 40 years now. I started designing cross stitch in 2021. I sketched up my first four designs, Hope, Summer at Pansy Patch Manor, followed by Spring, Fall and Winter at Pansy Patch Manor and turned them into cross stitch. I found the virtual Needlework Expo that fall and with the support of Janis entered that virtual tradeshow and my designs quickly took off, which was so exciting for me. Next followed Nashville Needlework Market and things just kept growing from there. I also do some quilt design and have three designs out currently, one being on the cover of Primitive Quilts and Projects.

My daughter, Emily, followed with her beautiful cross stitch design. Emily and have been creating and crafting together since she was eight. It is so much fun and such a blessing to have Emily to design with and bounce ideas off of. Emily does all the design for my chart covers. It is so exciting to see Emily's cross stitch design business growing. Emily inspires me every day and I look forward to every moment that we get to spend together.

We recently moved to three acres and have renovated our barn into our design studio. How thankful I am to have that creative space with my daughter, Emily.

Emily: I've always been a creative person and have always had my hands in some kind of craft or art form, from drawing and painting to textile arts like quilting, crochet and stitching, so cross stitch came naturally to me. I graduated from college in 2023 with a degree in graphic design and started designing cross stitch that same year. The skills I learned in graphic design helped so much as I began to experiment with cross stitch design and to grow my business.

Seeing the work my mom was doing with her design business was also a huge inspiration for me to start designing as well. Much of what I know I learned from my mom, and having a mom who loves to do the same things is such a blessing. We inspire each other, and we always have someone to bounce ideas off of and someone to cheer us on.

1. what is your favorite design and why?

Lori: My favourite design of mine is The Simple Tranquility Sampler. It encompasses everything I love about being at home: Stitching, gardening, chickens and just relaxing and enjoying a simple lifestyle. Home is my favourite place to be and handwork and stitching sooth the mind and soul.

Emily: My favourite design of mine is In Nature. I feel like it embodies my love of the natural world. One of my favourite things to do is to go outside, take a walk, and notice the small shifts as the days go by and seasons change. I love listening to the birds, and looking at the different bugs, fungus, and flowers. There is always something new to notice. Being outside calms my mind and body in a way nothing else can.

2. is there a design that you would love to create one day?

Lori: I would love to do a monthly cross stitched quilt block inspired series – 12 of them – that would finish on one piece as a big sampler with lots of flowers and a beautiful border.

Emily: I've had one idea bouncing around in my head for quite a few months now. My favourite book is The Secret Garden by Frances Hodgson Burnett, and I'd love to create a sampler loosely inspired by Misselthwaite Manor, with a stately manor, beautiful gardens, and all kinds of plants. I've only done a handful of large designs, and I'd love to keep designing some bigger pieces.

3. what do you do besides designing?

Lori: Most of my time is spent designing and creating. I also do quilt design and am learning how to use my long arm. I love spending time stitching, quilting, crocheting, doing hand stitching and gardening. I love spending time with my family and friends. My older daughter, Amy, had a baby boy 5 and ½ months ago and I love spending as much time with them as I can. I have two labs, Olive and Winnie that I love wandering our property with and just hanging out with.

Emily: Most of my spare time is spent creating. I have a lot of cross stitch projects that aren't my own designs that I love to work on when I'm not model stitching. I also love all kinds of stitching, crochet, quilting, and reading. I love to be outside whenever I can, and I love to garden. I go camping as often as possible in the warmer months as well, and I love to canoe and hike while I'm there.

4. do you stitch your models yourself?

Both: We try to stitch as many models as we can ourselves. When it comes to times of the year when there are big shows, like Nashville Needlework Market, coming up, we usually have to use a couple model stitchers to get everything finished in time. Shows are when we release most of our designs, and usually five to seven at a time, so getting everything stitched ourselves isn't always possible. We are very thankful to have amazing and quick model stitchers to help us.

5. what is the biggest chance you saw in the industry in the past 5 years?

Both: The biggest change we've seen is huge shift towards a more digital market. With the start of stitching podcasts on YouTube, there has been so many new stitchers joining our community which is wonderful. Since the pandemic hit, we've started to rely on more digital means to advertise and distribute our designs. Shipping and import fees can make it challenging financially for international shops and stitchers to obtain our designs, and PDF sales allow our designs to be more accessible to stitchers across the globe.

6. if you wouldn't be a designer, what occupation would you have?

Lori: I was a legal assistant/law clerk for 35 years so that is probably where I would still be. I always wanted to branch into design and am so thankful that the opportunity arose and hope to continue in design. I am so thankful for this creative way of love and love my design business.

Emily: If I wasn't a designer, I probably would have ended up being an environmental scientist. That would have been a perfect career for me with my passion for the natural world and my love of learning and science. However, something has always been pushing towards a creative career. I can't remember a time when I wasn't working on some sort of creative hobby, and I think design was such a natural choice for me to start my own creative design business. I am so grateful for my career in design, and I love what I do.

7. what is the latest project that you stitched?

Lori: I am currently working on my next series – The Houses on Stitchery Lane. It follows The Houses on Peppermint Lane, Pumpkin Lane and Wisteria lane.

Emily: I recently finished a small Christmas/winter design. It features a mouse letter-carrier pulling a sled full of letters. He's bundled up in his coziest mittens and scarf, and in walking through the snow to deliver his letters. This design is releasing in November of this year.

8. where do you get your ideas from (favorite from customers).

Lori: I love family, big houses, nature, flowers and quilting. Most of my design is inspired by these things, along with some whimsical, kind of primitive designs thrown in. I love autumn and autumn colours and designs are my favourite. I love to do series and seasonal series.

Emily: Most of my inspiration comes from the natural world. I gather a lot of inspiration on my walks and take lots of pictures of the things I find. I'm really inspired by the changing seasons, and I tend to design and stitch things seasonally. In the fall I love to stitch pumpkins and witches, in the winter I stitch snowy and Christmassy things, and in the spring and summer I love to stitch flowers, birds, and trees.

9. Have you considered designing a project together?

Both: We've designed a few projects together already! We had Mistletoe Manor, which was an exclusive we designed for the 2024 Stitch and Stash Retreat in Edmonton. We also did Quaker Farmhouse Sampler, which was an exclusive for a shop hop run by Shanty Stitchers, Stitchery Nook and Welcome Stitchery in summer of this year. It will release at Nashville Needlework Market in 2026. We plan to keep designing projects together in the future as well. We have a lot of fun working on designs together.

The nice thing is that mother Lori is releasing a series with all kinds of animals, Red Bunny Sampler is a beautiful pattern from which you can get all kinds of motifs for other works, but that you can also just stitch as it is on the pattern. Just that bunny to make a scissor hanger out of it.....

Little Red Schoolhouse has two of my favorites, an alphabet (well, two) and a house (well, school). This cushion lends itself well to a colour challenge. Stitch it in colors that you would not otherwise choose.

So the project went with me in the bag to Swindon and there I was able to stitch my annual Santa Claus. For the finish, we chose a round tube this year, which we, well Coby, covered with fabric. The tube is wide enough that a vase can fit in it and there is now a beautiful Christmas bouquet in it. I am very satisfied with this finish, it is always nice when you can use an stitched project in everyday life.

In addition to Santa Claus, we also brought out Nordic Holiday this year. It's one of the patterns that I've had in my possession for years and of which I had already stitched two. I chose Threadworx [1089](#) and [1048](#) with a [little bit of gold thread](#). Coby has used the beads for the finish that you will find in our Christmas box.



In addition, Coby has stitched two more so that we can also show you how the Christmas chenille can be used for the finishing. Didn't it become a picture? We have matched the colors DMC to the Christmas chenille and so you can make a beautiful color-coordinated ornament.



Starry Night is a pattern that was not available for a long time because it was out of print. This pattern is also stitched with only 2 colors of DMC and I would also add some [silver thread](#). The challenge of this pattern is to make a bell cord out of it. You can of course stitch the five landscape patterns below each other, but what do you do with those 2 portrait patterns? I don't have a ready-made solution, but I would make a copy of the pattern and then cut and slide until the two patterns have the same image. What would you do?

### 34. Primrose Cottage Stiches



I thought this was one of the nicest snow maze patterns we have received. I think it would be very nice to stitch it and then tie it around a cookie tin or glass jar. Then delicious homemade cookies in it and then you either have a very nice tin to put in your living room or a personal gift to take with you when you visit someone around the holidays.

This almost became the pattern that was always not delivered ;-). Fortunately, I received a pile a while ago, because it is really a pillow for Christmas/winter time. The Quaker cushions from Primrose Cottage are very popular and fun to stitch anyway. You only need 4 colors and you can easily put together your own palette. Think for example of English Ivy, Snowflake, Hickory Sticks and Bandana or Bing Cherry from Classic Colorworks. Or use 1048 and 1089 from Threadworx and add DMC B5200 and 844. And if you want to make it completely festive, you can choose the Belfast 1111 or the Edinburgh 1111, they have a sparkle and give the pattern that little bit extra.

For the Christmas catalogue we have specially ordered packages of her animal patterns and Christmas patterns. These are complete packages, there is even a needle in it. It's really just sorting out the thread and you can start. You can choose from bookmarks or scissor hangers, but I also think both types of packages are very suitable for Christmas ornaments. They are super fun to stitch but also to give as a gift.



### 36. Fabric sample packages for Christmas and Winter

This year we have made four fabric packages that will help you through Christmas and winter. This time the packages mainly contain fabrics that I really like to use myself. All fabrics are 25 x 35cm so you can use it for ornaments but also for patterns that are a bit larger.

Let me start with the Newcastle package. These are 5 pieces of 16-thread linen in colors that you can use for all kinds of projects. The almost turquoise color on the far right is a color that is now out of the collection, so grab your chance now to stitch a beautiful stitching project on it. On the far left you see the dark taupe color on which you can stitch very well with light thread. The light blue fabric in the middle is a favorite for me for everything that shouts "winter".

7025: dark taupe

1079: white with beige/green cloudy

7106: ice blue

The Edinburgh kit of 14 thread fabric has, in addition to the 4 colors of linen, also a piece of [Super Fein Floba](#), on which I [stitched Christmas Reindeer in the Forest](#). I think it's great fabric to stitch on and because the fabric is not completely plain, it is ideal for a kind of "nature" background. This package also contains the color 1111, a white linen with sparkles, really for Christmas. These fabrics are also ideal for the Flossabilities patterns. We have also added the new green color, this fabric has just been released and fits well with a Christmas pattern.

For our Belfast, 12.6dr/cm package, we have chosen two classics. First the natural background with white dots so you don't have to stitch all those snowflakes, they are already on the fabric. And you get a piece of natural linen with sparkles through it. You can stitch any Christmas pattern on it. And we found a roll of Lambswool linen, the old version with the small brown seeds in it. The color that The Prairie Schooler used for almost all of its patterns. Enjoy it while it's still there, the color has completely changed and looks different now. Completely new are the fabrics with the coffee beans on them and the matching solid color. We are big fans and can't wait to stitch something on it.

These are the colors in the Belfast package:

Finally, we have put together an evenweave kit, also very suitable for stitching over 1 thread. In this kit you will find the [10 thread Floba](#), a great fabric to stitch on, I stitched the Blue Coat Santa from Teresa Kogut on it. Of course on a larger piece, but the fabric is highly recommended. Also in this package an ice blue color, a dark color that all snow patterns stand out nicely and a piece of Jobelan, because everyone should have a piece of Jobelan at home.




### 38. Shannon Christine Designs

From Shannon we not only have her annual Nutcracker this year (click here for [the 2024 Nutcracker](#) and [2023 Nutcracker](#)) but she has now also released two smaller Nutcrackers. You understand that I am all for that. What do you think, wouldn't it be nice to finish these nut crackers just like the Animal Crackers from Stacy Nash? So leave out the edge and make dolls out of it? I am completely intrigued by this and I think I will try it out.

The 2025 Nutcracker is an imposing appearance with its drum and light blue outfit. You could also make a stand-up out of this, then I would weigh down the bottom so that it doesn't fall over. Shannon often uses a combination of metallic thread and beading for her annual Nutcracker, so it looks really festive.

Who also look festive are the Festive Penguins. Here you could very well make an elongated cushion. I had already explained that I have a thing for those elongated cushions. These 3 penguins lend themselves very well to it. Take one of the Teresa Kogut quilting fabrics for the back and they can keep you company during the Christmas season.






Finally, we have Woodland Winter, a completely different pattern. I always think it's great when designers can evoke multiple atmospheres with their patterns. This pattern really reminds me of a quiet winter morning, and then taking a nice walk in the woods. Who knows, you might also come across a deer or a rabbit. Of course, you can also stitch the Christmas tree separately and make a Christmas card out of it. Or stitch one of the snow crystals for a card or scissor hanger. Shannon didn't use any metallic or beads for this pattern but I think you could add them very well.

### 39. Shepherd's Bush

The annual Christmas stockings from Shepherd's Bush are always very popular. Usually the patterns come out a bit later than our Christmas catalog, and then I save the pattern for the new catalog. This time I'm going to show you the last two patterns, one for a boy/man and one for a girl/woman. What I love about these patterns is that they stitch very nicely and you can choose how much thread fabric you want to stitch them on. I have seen different versions from 10 wire Fein Floba to 16 wire natural. If you want to complete the Christmas stockings, a set with the charms is really recommended, they fit exactly and give just that little bit extra.



I stitched the snow crystal cushion years ago with 2 threads on Belfast 1111, white linen with a small glimmer in it. The fabric is also in the Edinburgh fabric package, but the Belfast version is still for sale. I don't know yet how I'm going to finish it, but I think it's going to be a small pillow with a button in the middle. The snowman patterns can be stitched on all kinds of fabrics and are also very nice to give as a gift.


#### 40. Stacy Nash Designs

The Animal Crackers from Stacy Nash are a huge hit, I think everyone has stitched one or has one at home to stitch. I now have a small collection of these cute animals and hope I can add a few more. In January I started stitching Chilli. This penguin looks deceptively easy to stitch, but make no mistake, as those little ^^ in its belly require a lot of concentration. And there are a lot of white crosses in it. But when it's finished, you also have a super cute penguin for your collection.

I haven't stitched Blizzard yet, but this fox also deserves a place in my Animal Cracker zoo. I think I would take a deeper shade of blue or maybe teal for his jersey, but otherwise I can get started with it right away.

## 41. Stitches by Ethel

Stitches by Ethel has some super cute Christmas patterns this year. I'm all about Chicken and Waffles myself. The reason? I follow an Instagram account in which grumpy cat Waffles has to live together with golden retriever Maple. Waffles is not charmed by Maple, or by the other roommate (husband of the account holder). Actually, Waffles especially loves Waffles and his wife. I think it's so funny to see what he does. Although this pattern doesn't have a Golden Retriever, donkey Waffles is just too sweet. And then those chickens, you would take them home in no time. Or stitch one as a card or scissor hanger.

Holly Basket Pinkeep is a completely different pattern, a very nice size for an ornament or Christmas pin cushion. You can stitch the edge or use a narrow edge for it. And I think I would also change the bow to a thin ribbon with maybe a glitter in it.

At Christmas Moon, Ethel has gone back to her usual animals, a bird. This cardinal deserves a place in your Christmas tree or on the wall. My idea would be to stitch only the moon and the cardinal and then finish them on one of our sets with round cardboard (acid-free) circles.

Finally, we have Christmas Delivery, my favorite mouse is back. Like a real Santa Claus, he controls the sleigh with presents. That raven will probably have quite a workout bringing the presents everywhere. Super fun to finish this pattern as a pin drum, or as an elongated cushion.



## 42. Teresa Kogut

If you've been following me on Youtube for the past year (create link) you've seen that I've stitched the Blue Coat Santa from Teresa Kogut. I took 10 ply fabric (Fein Floba, great to stitch on) and spent most of December and January working on this Santa. We finished it like a big "doll" and I hope that in due course a few more Santa Clauses will keep this blue version company.

Santa Claus is the same Santa Claus as the one from Naughty or Nice Stocking, but stitched in green colors. If you prefer to stitch it in blue, you will need Blue Corn and Blue Jeans for this.

The patches are 30 x 55cm, so you can easily finish 2-3 stitchies per patch. Or 1 piece of work if you want to use it for the back of a pillow, for example.

### 43. Vaupel & Heilenbeck band

Looking for a suitable linen ribbon for That's a Wrap, I realized that we have even more very nice Christmas ribbons in the shop. The big advantage of linen tape is that you only have to do something at the top and bottom for the finish. We also have a solution for that, you will see that later.

The 5cm block band is ideal for small motifs and looks great on cards or make small scissor hangers. You can stitch a motif of maximal 22 x 22 on it. If you stitch an elongated pattern, you can of course boru more crosses lengthwise. On linen binding you can easily stitch over 1 thread and then you can stitch quite large motifs of up to 44 x 44cm. So there are plenty of options. The price is per 10 blocks of tire.

Then we have a slightly wider band with a nice heart edge. You can choose from two color combinations. I thought it would be fun to stitch [Starry Night](#) on the white and blue border ribbon. The tape is 11.5cm wide, but you have 9cm of space for stitching. The price is per 50cm.

I also really like to use these two straps. You can stitch all kinds of Christmas motifs on both, just keep in mind that white does not look good on this, then you would have to stitch a back stitch around it. The price is per 50cm.

The natural/red striped version is very suitable for stitching a Santa Claus, I had the Noel Santa from JBW Designs in mind. Then you can make a nice bag out of it. For the red and white star band I also have two patterns from JBW Designs in mind, namely [Joyeus Noel](#) and [Oh Christmas Tree](#). The price is again for 50cm.






